Dear DSMB members, National Coordinators and Local Investigators of PROTHOR,

The PROTHOR DSMB met September 30th via video to discuss the results of the third interim analysis. Members present were Daniel Sessler, Arthur Slutsky, Jean-Louis Vincent, and Jennifer Hunter. Jakob Wittenstein, the trial coordinator, presented. Mert Sentürk and Marcelo Gama de Abreu were also present. The Board reviewed enrolment, which remains reasonable despite the pandemic. Neither a priori efficacy nor futility boundaries were crossed. In a closed session, the Board reviewed adverse events and serious adverse events. After some discussion via email, the DSMB recommends continuing the trial.

On 19th of October, 1525 patients were randomised in the study. Thereby the PROTHOR trial is already the largest trial on mechanical ventilation in thoracic anaesthesia. By reaching the total sample size (2378 patients), the PROTHOR trial will be the largest trial on mechanical ventilation in general. We are confident to reach this goal together with you. Currently we have 83 registered centres working on the study and the number of centres is still increasing. We thank you for your untiring commitment in the study.

In the future, we will send an email once a week with the patients included per centre. On this way, we would like to motivate you to include patients and also express our sincere appreciation.
